### ADJUNCT PROFESSOR, SENIOR RESEARCHER UNIVERSITY OF OULU, FINLAND

Dr. Guido Giunti is a medical doctor specialised in digital health solutions for chronic care. He has worked in academic, clinical, and industrial settings at top organisations in Europe; and he has combined his medical, technological, and entrepreneurial expertise to lead the development of "More Stamina", a gamified digital health solution for people with Multiple Sclerosis.

Dr. Giunti's work has received numerous awards, including a Marie Sklodowska-Curie fellowship, the Best Doctoral Dissertation award, and recognition as one of Finland's top healthcare innovators by the medical magazine Mediuutiset. In 2021, he was selected as one of Argentina's Ten Outstanding Young Persons of the year by the Junior Chamber International due to his work on medical innovations.

Dr. Guido Giunti currently leads the work on Digital Therapeutics at Trinity College Dublin and is an Adjunct Professor of Digital Health Design and Development at the University of Oulu in Finland.

Wendy Hendrie has specialised in the management of multiple sclerosis and complex neurodisability for over forty years. She has worked in the NHS, on Younger Disabled Units and in MS Therapy Centres. She completed a PhD in 2012 looking at the physical and psychological effects of regular standing frame use in the homes of people with progressive MS.

She was a member of the 2014 NICE Guideline Development Group for MS and was a founder member of the UK group Therapists in MS (TiMS), of which she was co-chair for six years. She lectures widely on all aspects of MS management and is on the Faculty of the MS Academy. She currently works as a clinician at an MS Centre in Norwich. As well as her clinical work, she is involved in a number of research and advisory projects in the UK.

translational research in multiple sclerosis,
including the development of diagnostic
